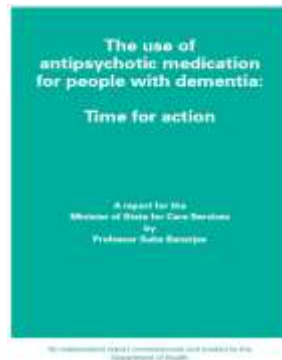
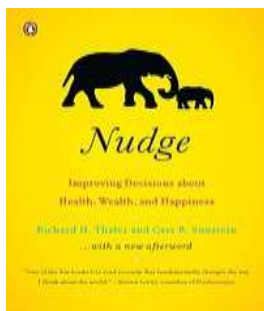
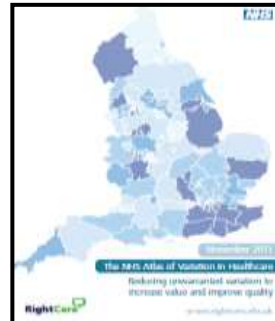


Dementia

- Diagnosis rates up to two thirds
- 600,000 NHS and social care staff had training
- 1.46 m dementia friends
- 142 Dementia friendly communities
- £60m in dementia research plus £150m for a Dementia Research Institute
- G8 summit on dementia
- Record numbers taking part in research

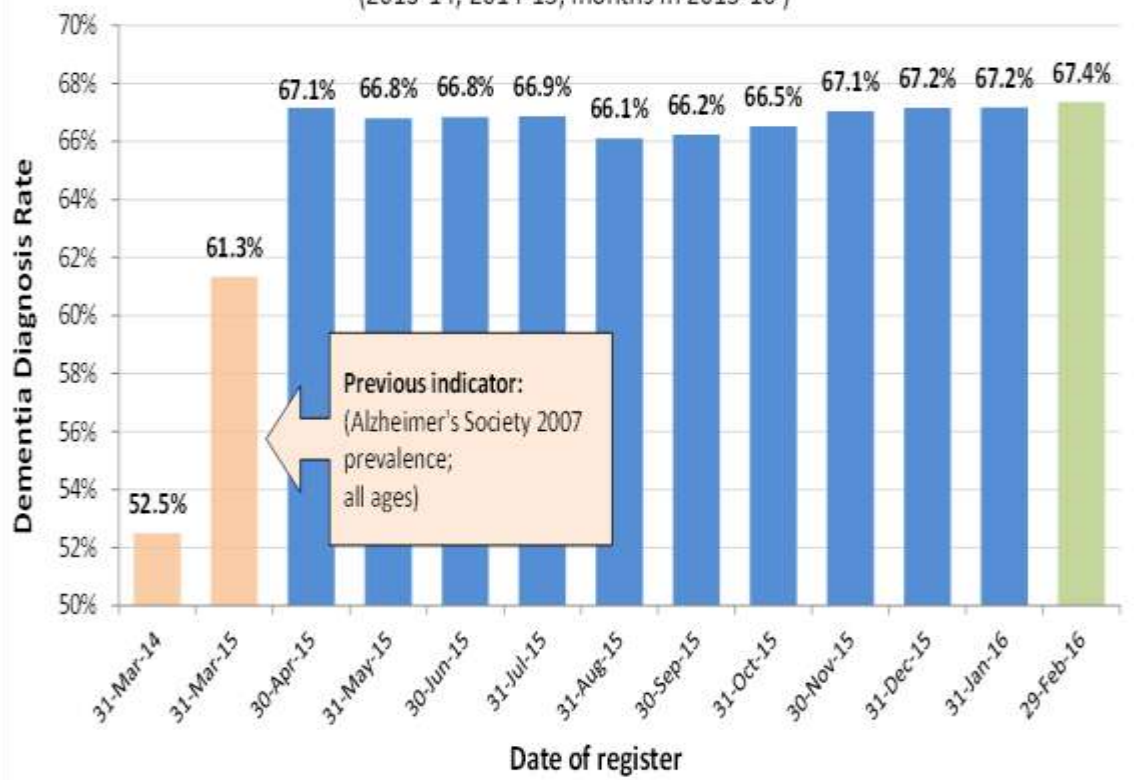
Importance of the clinical message
