PHE's work on HiAP

Why Health in All Policies?

The HiAP systematically addresses health and wellbeing in strategies and programmes by targeting broad health determinants.

A Framework to enhance policy co-ordination and cross-departmental & cross-sectoral collaboration:


- Horizontally: Between key policy domains and/or service areas at one tier of governance – both within a local authority and between multiple agencies.
- Vertically: Between different tiers of government and policy-making appreciating that decisions and actions at one level may inform and/or influence those at another level.

Local wellbeing, local growth: adopting Health in All Policies (HIAP)

- System leadership national masterclasses with DPHs
- Joint work with professional bodies Association of Directors of Public Health and Local Government Association
- First national resource to help local government improve local wellbeing and growth through its multiple functions, programmes, service areas and partnership working by embedding HIAP approach.

Multi-segmented tool with key sections:

- Overview (rationale, benefits of adopting HiAP)
- High impact infographics applied to priority areas (insecure employment, mental health, obesity, appropriate housing, giving every child the best start in life, public spaces and green areas)

Guidance on Place Based Approaches for Health Inequalities

We are now developing Joint Strategic Framework for Health Inequalities (working title)

The **aim** of the JSF is to provide a clear vision and structured approach for how health inequalities can be reduced, with guidance and tools to support local place-based action.

Focus: Deprivation and poverty. Not equality characteristics or inclusion health

The **objectives** are:

- To explain why action on health inequalities (HI) is urgent in order to instigate action
- To provide a practical framework and tools for places to use for organising action
- To showcase current examples of activity on HI

Authors: PHE, ADPH, LGA.


NHS England and local NHS systems engaged in the development of the work



The Framework takes and adapts existing models to demonstrate the complex causes of health inequalities, and support place-based action to reduce them.

Next steps

- Testing: identifying some local areas where we can test the Framework
- Publication: early summer
- Format of delivery:
 - Sector Led Improvements
 - Bespoke Workshops with Health Inequalities Unit
- Support for delivery: We have added 4 new people to the Health Inequalities Unit, based in our centres and regions who can support local areas with these tools.
- **Evaluation**: We will develop a robust mechanism to evaluate the use of tools and approach at a local level.
- Sharing practice: Case studies of good practice will continue to be identified and shared.
